





Diffusion of Beaten Bark culture



RAMAYANA 9th century


1. The *Ramayana* contains the first report of *daluang* in old Javanese literature. According to Poerbatjakarta stems from the 9th century.

(...Apa tan pasahaya tunga-tungal, daluwang wedihanya ruksa duhka, phalamulasana yumanan ganan, ikanan saksana yalahata denta...4,66)















